- One of 15 agencies that comprise the Executive Office of Health and Human Services (EOHHS)



MCB Mission Statement

- The Massachusetts Commission for the Blind (MCB) provides the highest quality rehabilitation and social services to individuals who are blind, leading to independence and full community participation.
- MCB accomplishes this critical mission by working in partnership with consumers who are legally blind, families, community agencies, health care providers, and employers.



MCB Consumers

- MCB provides services to MA residents who are registered with the agency by an eye doctor
- The definition of legal blindness; Central vision loss of 20/200 or less in the better eye with correction or
- Peripheral field of ten degrees or less regardless of central vision acuity







- Evaluation for magnification
- Safety in the kitchen and meal prep
- Self care
- Problem solving
- Closed Circuit Television use
- Computer skills using adaptive technology

- Provides and teaches proper use of low vision devices including;
 - Cooking tools
 - Magnifiers
 - Talking time pieces
 - Bold Lined paper & 20/20 pens
 - Lighting


